- Later, radio and television also became mediums for news



Then came the Internet

- The Internet opened up new avenues for communication
- Many of those avenues were outside of traditional news media
- With so many alternative choices, the status of traditional media is declining
- According to the Pew Research Center (right), social media is the preferred source of news for more people than newspapers are now

Social media is like a free bulletin board

- Anybody can post anything they want on it
- You can share things with anybody else who is online (possibly millions of people!)
- A lot of this "sharing" includes opinions, speculation, falsehoods, conspiracy theories, propaganda, and other misinformation



Make your own statement

- Memes are popular on social media
- Many are funny
- Others spread falsehoods
- The absurd meme on the right was created free on the internet in about a minute



Photos are easily manipulated



Another online manipulation

Becomes like a funnel



Online algorithms filter what you see

Based on:

- Your location
- Previous searches
- Previous clicks
- Previous purchases
- Overall popularity

This creates filter bubbles



Filter bubbles: good and bad

- Good: You get to things you want to see faster
- Good: You are not distracted by things that do not interest you
- Good: Suggestions point you to related information
- Bad: There is a lot you do not see
- Bad: You are not exposed to other information or viewpoints
- Bad: They create tunnel vision
- Bad: You might start to "live" only in your bubble




Your filter bubble can become an echo chamber

- Everybody there shares the same ideas and values
- Everything affirms and reinforces those same ideas and values
- Other information, viewpoints, and opinions are shut out
